SSF Gender is a UWI CERMES-led GIFT project that aims to provide more in-depth knowledge of gender in fisheries to inform the implementation of the FAO's Small-Scale Fisheries (SSF) Guidelines, the Caribbean Community Common Fisheries Policy (CCCFP) SSF Protocol, and to support FAO's Blue Growth initiative in various projects.

The project will focus on delivering the following outputs:

Output 1

Communicating with policy makers and policy advisors

support the evidence-based and advocacy-oriented policy influence of project partners and facilitate planning of the International Year of Artisanal Fisheries and Aquaculture (IYAFA), 2022.

Output 2

Mainstreaming gender equality informed by gender analysis

continue scoping study of gender in fisheries in Caribbean Regional Fisheries Mechanism (CRFM) countries to achieve both deeper and wider coverage linked especially to SDG 5 and SDG 14.
