Oak will make US\$500K available annually for marine conservation in Belize for five years as the MAR Fund raises the matching funds.</li> <li>2) Getch Foundation: US\$500k over two years for programmatic support of projects in the areas of effective management practices of the network of coastal and marine protected areas, establishment, expansion and management of fish replenishment zones (no takes), monitoring and surveillance of spawning aggregation sites, reef and mangrove restoration and resilience, enhanced protection of flagship and keystone species for ecosystems health, promoting stewardship of resource conservation focusing on youth, and risk reduction and ocean resilience."</li> </ul>
