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Stewardship and Livelihoods in Caribbean Small-Scale Fisheries (StewardFish) project CNFO Leadership Institute Pilot Report

The seven countries participating in the Developing Organizational Capacity for Ecosystem Stewardship and Livelihoods in Caribbean Small-Scale Fisheries (StewardFish) project – Antigua and Barbuda, Barbados, Belize, Guyana, Jamaica, Saint Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines have a high dependence on fisheries resources, whether for income generation, nutrition and food security.

The CNFO will be coordinating and collaborating with UWI-CERMES in delivery of services with the latter being the lead organization in conducting the activities.

The CNFO in collaboration with partners outline the steps taken for the piloting of the "leadership Institute".

Technical Support

A meeting was held on zoom with CNFO (Nadine), CERMES (Maria), CIRP (Dr. Kim, Kevon, Gideon and Myron) on 14th February 2020 to get technical advice on piloting the leadership training. The CIRP team advised on the below ideas.

- It was agreed that the pilot will be on SKYPE with protocols and limited number of participants (8).
- The sessions will be recorded on SKYPE and uploaded to the CNFO's YOUTUBE channel then posted on the google classroom.
- Participants will return completed registration form by EMAIL. Remind participants to remember access credentials.
- Classified directory of participants and mentors.
- Follow-up training with WhatsApp call.
- The forum can take place via WhatsApp group (more structured use website, email or google classroom)

- Post a weekly tip on site then share from the site from Facebook and twitter. (Gideon will assist to create a post category for weekly tip)
- Training materials will be placed on google classrooms for participants to access.
- There is google classroom app.
- (Gender training can be done on the leadership institute?)
- All tools used are free, therefore there are limitations.

A meeting was held on SKYPE on 16th March 2020 with CNFO (Nadine & Mitch) and CIRP (Dr. Kim, Kevon and Gideon), (CERMES (Maria).

- CNFO is interested in getting the forum and mentoring launched with the training.
- Each module will have its own google classroom.
- CIRP will assist if needed during the next two weeks in setting up google classroom. Gideon will train Nadine to set up a google classroom, they will collaborate (CIRP and CNFO) on a google classroom guide to preparing the classroom and CIRP getting feedback.
- CNFO leadership book and modules will be sent to Gideon.
- Meetings will be recorded. Better to record with the purpose of recording compared to recording session for playback. Incorporate national organisations to have the recording repository for national trainings outside of the CNFO. Need to access the recordings for both Wi-Fi and downloadable access. (This is where the mentoring comes into play because someone can use the recording as a tool to offer one-on-one interaction.)
- Need central repository of shared content for mentors.
- IT WAS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT A CNFO GMAIL ACCOUNT AND NOT A PERSONAL ACCOUNT IS USED TO CREATE THE GOOGLE CLASSROOM. (The storage will contribute to your personal account)
- Free google classroom: 250 participants, 15gb (google drive), 30 classes per day. A person can join 100 classes maximum.
- Each member of the classroom needs to have a gmail account to access the google classroom. CNFO (Nadine) will assist those who need help with creating accounts.
- The resources in the google classroom is the library for now. Website is good for permanent library because you can classify by theme and leave there permanently. For now, the CNFO will use 1 classroom for all the resources.

CIRP (Gideon) demo the setting up of google classroom to CNFO (Nadine) on 17th March 2020. (download recording from skype and upload to YouTube).

Registration Process

The CNFO advertised the leadership institute in its December 2019 newsletter (Appendix 1) and other platforms. The registration process for the piloting of the training with Module 1 Exploring Leadership was between 13-20 March 2020 and was advertised on the CNFO Facebook (Appendix 2), Instagram, twitter and WhatsApp. The registration form (Appendix 3) could have been downloaded from the CNFO website. All 8 persons who applied received the information about registration via WhatsApp and emailed their completed form.

Couple persons questioned whether the piloting of the training would have been affected by COVID-19, however all registered persons expressed their interest and availability to proceed. The registration form was sent to UWI-CERMES for their contribution.

Orientation

On 25th March 2020 the CNFO created a WhatsApp group with all registered fisherfolk. The original registration did not state that gmail was necessary to access the google classroom so that and other minor matters were clarified via WhatsApp.

Between 30-31 March 2020 registered persons participated in an orientation.

- They accessed the google classroom for resources (module 1 notes, PowerPoint presentation and about the leadership institute).
- They were sent the meeting protocols by WhatsApp
- They were reminded of some of the meeting protocols at a skype testing.
 - 1. We will start 8:30 pm sharp on SKYPE
 - 2. The call will be recorded and posted on CNFO YOUTUBE Channel.
 - 3. Please keep a note pad and pen nearby for your personal use.
 - 4. There will be 30 mins for open discussions.
 - 5. Remember to join the google classroom to access meeting documents.
 - 6. Protocols: mute mic when not speaking, keep video off, the training will be facilitated by Mitch.
 - 7. I will test skype individually to test mic and speakers prior to meeting. We can set up at a time convenient to you between 4:00 pm and 8:00 pm Eastern Caribbean time.

Piloting of the Leadership Training

The first training was scheduled for 31st March 2020; however due to an emergency of the facilitator Mitchell Lay the training was postponed last minute to 1st April 2020. The nature of the emergency was explained to the participants via WhatsApp and all 8 persons responded positively that they were available for the new date. FAO

Post Leadership Training

The eight participants were asked about the format of training, the effectiveness of modules and overall impressions. Some participants commented on the training. Overall, they liked the format and commented that the facilitator was very knowledgeable and engaging. The module was consistent with modern leadership theories. They felt that the training is timely and effective. Recommendations were to have follow up and practical exercises. They are looking forward to future modules.

The 8 participants in addition to the two CNFO staff members pictures and short bio was published on the CNFO Facebook page.

FAO and UWI-CERMES were asked for comments which they supplied. Between the two modules some interaction with the google classroom will take place as 1 assignment was posted to the classroom.

There has been 1 new registration submitted for the next training before its announcement. The next training is likely to take place on Tuesday 5th May 2020. This will be announced at least 2 weeks prior to the date.





Fisherfolk are impacted by many other players. Leadership secures interests


Value differing perspectives can negatively impact fishers:

WHO LEADS FISHERFOLK ORGANISATIONS?

The ____ who uses their influence to enlist the support of others to achieve a shared goal or objective.

Groups with poor leadership may have several differing leaders.

 Good leadership focuses the entire group on shared goals.

Desired Leaders

- Movers and shakers excite others with a vision.
- Get members to commit to group goals.
- ·Work with and align people to group aims
- ·Caretakers of group culture, values and goals

HOW IS LEADERSHIP CARRIED OUT?

- Authoritarian (autocratic) The leader tells the group what to do, and how to do it without getting advice from the members.
- Participative (democratic) The leader includes one or more members in deciding what to do, and how to do it.
- Delegative (free reign) The leader allows the members to make the decisions, while providing overall guidance.





LEADERSHIP TODAY

- -Share power with the group
- ·Collaborative
- -Expresses the organisation's values
- ·Pull together strengths and talents of the team
- ·Have a caring and positive attitude toward people
- Are open about their weaknesses and are willing to admit their mistakes
